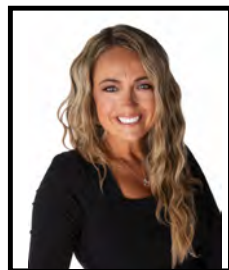

An 18-year-old from Highland, Elle is a recent graduate of Lone Peak High School and will begin her freshman year at Brigham Young University this fall. She plans to pursue a double major in Business and Journalism before continuing her education to earn a Juris Doctor degree. A lifelong learner and passionate communicator, Elle believes education and strong principles are the foundation for building a generation of confident, capable leaders. At the center of Elle's year of service is her community service initiative, C.P.R. — Every Beat Matters. After experiencing the loss of her younger brother following a sudden cardiac emergency, Elle became passionate about ensuring teens and families are prepared to respond in critical moments. Through partnerships with fire departments, schools, and community organizations, she has worked to expand CPR education and emergency preparedness, empowering others with the confidence and knowledge to make a difference when every second matters. Elle is a passionate advocate for America's youth and is dedicated to helping raise the next generation of leaders. She speaks across the country about the importance of building a life on strong principles, developing character, and having the courage to stand for what you believe. Her advocacy has taken her to national platforms, including appearances on Fox News with Kayleigh McEnany, where she has shared her perspective as a young leader, and a keynote address at a national gala held at Mar-a-Lago, where she helped raise more than \$700,000 to further expand and support teenage education initiatives across America. Beyond her advocacy work, Elle has dedicated thousands of hours to serving her community and beyond. She is a weekly partner with the 5.12 Foundation, which has helped provide meals to more than 45,500 food-insecure children, and has served with organizations including the American Heart Association, American Red Cross, Utah Foster Care, Big Brothers Big Sisters of Utah, the Utah 9/11 Memorial Museum, and The Road Home. In 2025, she participated in humanitarian service work in Kenya and Zimbabwe, strengthening her belief that service is one of the greatest ways to connect communities and change lives. Elle is also an accomplished classical violinist. Beginning at age four, she dedicated years to mastering her craft and was accepted into the Gifted Music School Conservatory on a full-ride \$30,000 annual scholarship. She has performed throughout the community and earned the Overall Talent Award during her journey to Miss Utah's Teen with her performance of Monti Czardas. She was also selected as one of eight violinists from more than 300 applicants for the BYU Musicians Institute. When she is not traveling across Utah, speaking, volunteering, or preparing for the Miss America's Teen stage, Elle enjoys teaching private violin lessons, Chick-fil-A Spicy Chicken Sandwiches, and spending time with family and friends. Elle is grateful for the opportunity to represent Utah and is excited to celebrate the incredible young women competing for the Miss Iron County title. 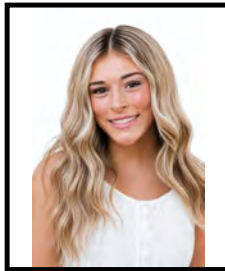

Scoring

As an official local preliminary to the Miss America Opportunity, the Miss Iron County Scholarship Competition celebrates scholarship, service, style, and success. Contestants are evaluated in five areas: Private Interview (30%), On Stage Question (10%), Health & Fitness (20%), Talent (20%), and Evening Gown (20%). Each phase of competition allows candidates to showcase their confidence, communication skills, character, and unique abilities as they compete for the opportunity to represent Iron County at the Miss Utah Competition in 2027.

The Five Points of the Crown

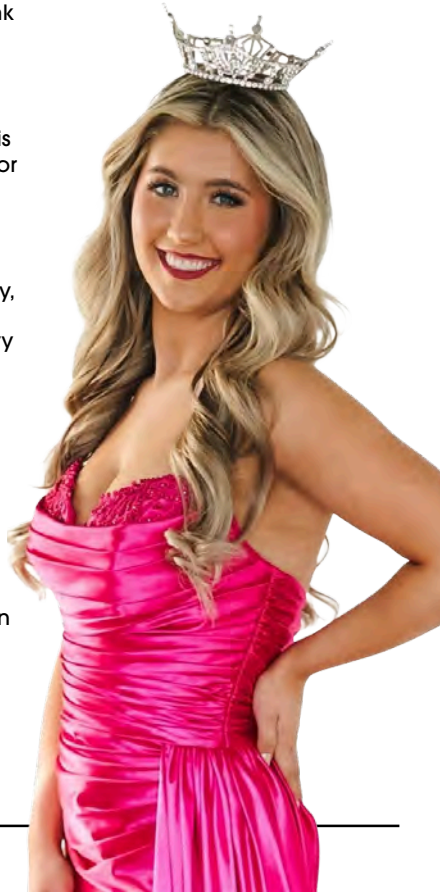
Miss Iron County's Farewell
